Christ's resurrection and before His ascension to heaven, "he gave gifts to his people" (4:8); some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ." (4:11-13)

The word equip literally

means, "to put in working order" or "to repair." In classical Greek, it refers to setting a broken bone. In the Gospels, to equip means to mend a torn net. The ideal state of a net is to be strong enough to catch and hold fish. A torn net is worthless because a fisherman cannot use it for its intended purpose. If the fisherman can repair it, he once again may use it to fulfill that purpose. (R. Logan, Beyond Church Growth)

To equip is to put into order whatever is not working in the church. The apostle Paul gave a check list on how to effectively equip: "for the work of ministry, building up the body of the church, growing and maturing Christians to arrive into the full stature of Christ." To equip congregation members that will do and become like the description in Ephesians 4:12 is the challenge.

AFC Weekly Bulletin Insert Highlights Wings to Reading


Your church should have received the curriculum materials for the America For Christ Offering 2012.

The Unseen Ministry

Dear Loved Ones.

Greeting and Peace of our risen Lord onto each one of you.

Many people ask us about what Kihomi does when she is not helping dig latrines, training her leaders, conducting seminars, counseling families, empowering women, or helping with small economic projects.

Here is an example of Kihomi's unseen and unspoken ministries. She visits people and prays with them. One day, she started by visiting a women in the Limbe catholic hospital. Then in the afternoon, she was visiting Ma DA. This lady suffers of glaucoma and has been receiving her eve care at our eye clinic. But because of a mistake she made Ma Da could barely open her eyes. Tears were constantly pouring out. Ma Da was talking about going to see another doctor.

When Kihomi came home she told me about the pitiful situation of Ma Da. The next day, I decided to visit her. She was in very bad shape. I asked her to come with me to our eye clinic. When we got to the clinic, I wanted to see Ma Da's file. When the head nurse reads it, it was obvious that Ma Da has continued using the medication the doctor has dis-

continued. When she got the right medicine, tears stop and Ma Da could open her eyes again. Three days later I visited her and she could not stop thanking the Lord for the miracle.

Saturday February 4, at 10:30 PM, we were already in bed snoring. Kihomi's phone rang. A lady was announcing to her the heart attack death of the husband of one of her leaders. The next day, Kihomi was in the truck on her way to Pilate. When she got there, she finds many visitors to comfort the widow. Unfortunately, no one among the visitors who thought about asking the widow how she was. When Kihomi asked this question, she told her that she was dizzy since vesterday when her husband died. She has lost her balance and could hardly walk. Kihomi put the lady in the truck to take her to the small health clinic in Pilate. The nurse there found that the widow's blood pressure was way high and was risking a major crisis. Thank God she was treated.

In the afternoon in Pilate, Kihomi spent time with the Pastor's family whose wife in her thirty's had a stroke. She is one of Kihomi's God daughters she has been mentoring since she was at the university where we are. Kihomi had time to counsel

and bring her health education to them.

This is how God of love, God of miracles, is using her servant Kihomi to be of help to her people.

Please be praying for:

A better understanding of what God wants us to do

The new semester staring at the university,

The new acting president of the university

The emotional and physical strength for us to continue what God has called us to do.



Two Churches/Two Journeys/One Service

Japanese Baptist and Seattle First Baptist Churches worship together in remembrance.

Wonderful, beautiful, aweinspiring, just a few of the
words used to describe a
unique Sunday morning worship experience at Seattle
First Baptist Church on Sunday, February 12, 2012. The
Japanese Baptist Church,
symbolically closed its doors
to join Seattle First Baptist
Church for this one Sunday,
to express gratitude for
founding Japanese Baptist
Church over 110 years ago
and supporting the church,

and the Japanese Community during World War II and the internment of the Japanese. It was the beginning of a week of remembrance preceding the 70th anniversary of the signing of Executive Order 6099 by President Roosevelt which resulted in the Japanese who were living on the west coast being put into concentration camps in the desert interiors of the country. The service included music shared by a combined choir of exquisite presentations, including a piano and pipe organ offertory of "What a Friend We Have in Jesus".

Two presentations were made: one to the son (Mark Jensen) of the pastor of Seattle First Baptist at the time of the internment by the son (Brooks Andrews) of the pastor of Japanese Baptist Church at the time of the internment. And a thank you to Justice Charles Z. Smith to remember his commemoration of unity with the symbol of his ABC/USA presidency which hangs in both Seattle First And Japanese Baptist Churches. Everyone present was blessed!



have brought their unique blend of spiritual wisdom and humor to audiences in the US. Israel-Palestine and Japan. Their first book, Getting to the Heart of Interfaith (Skylight Paths, 2009), brought the Interfaith Amigos international attention with coverage including the New York Times, CBS News, BBC Radio, and various NPR stations. Karen Armstrong calls their "exuberant and courageous" second book. Religion Gone Astray: What We Found at the Heart of Interfaith (Skylight Paths, 2011), "an inspiration and example for

all of us in these sadly polarized times." Their work is dedi-



cated to supporting more effective interfaith dialogue that can bring greater collaboration on the major social and economic issues of our time.

Mackenzie is head of staff at University Congregational UCC Church in Seattle, while Falcon is founder of meditative synagogues in Los Angeles and Seattle and Rahman is a Muslim Sufi Imam and co-founder of Seattle's Interfaith Community Church.

ABHMS Offers Grants for Programs Supporting Children in Poverty

VALLEY FORGE, PA (ABNS 2/14/12)—Congregations, regions and community ministries related to American Baptist Churches USA (ABCUSA) are invited to apply for 2012 grants from American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) for support of programs that address needs of children living in poverty in their local communities.

At least 10 grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000 will be distributed.

Last year's 22 grants totaling \$50,000 were awarded to children's ministries from the state of Washington to the island of Puerto Rico. The impact of the grant program

was expanded through a generous \$10,000 gift from The First Baptist Church (FBC) of Royal Oak (Mich.) Mission Fund, under the auspices of Genesis: The Church. (FBC of Royal Oak and Genesis: The Church merged in 2010.)

ABHMS' 2011 grants supported tutoring programs, educational enrichment, summer outreach and ministries to children of Burma refugees. In 2012, ABHMS seeks projects that address quality public school education, access to quality health care and support for caregivers to find employment that provides livable wages. Special attention, however, will be given to programs that focus

on partnerships with public schools in the 2012-2013 school year.

This is the fourth year that ABHMS has awarded Children in Poverty grants aimed at helping the 14 million and more children growing up with inadequate resources to nurture their God-given potential.

For thirty three years, The Common Ministry has invited nationally known theologians and scholars to the Palouse for the Roger Williams Symposium, an event that highlights the intersections of religion, academics, faith and learning in our world today.

This year, our keynote speaker is Dr. Willis Barnstone, speaking on *Poetry as the Voice of the Divine in the Gospels and Gnostic Scriptures*.

Dr. Barnstone (1927 -) is one of America's most prolific and highly regarded translators and poets - a Guggenheim Fellow, Pulitzer Prize finalist in poetry, and a distinguished Professor Emeritus at Indiana University.

Among Dr. Barnstone's publications are: The Other Bible (Harper-Collins 1984), To Touch the Sky: Poems of Mystical, Spiritual & Metaphysical Light (New Directions, 1999), The Apocalypse: Book of Revelation (New Directions 2000). The Gnostic Bible (Shambhala, 2003) with coauthor Marvin Meyer, The Restored New Testament (W. W. Norton, 2009), and his most recent publication *The* Poems of Jesus Christ (W.W. Norton April 2012)

Jesus Christ, whose teachings have been on the lips of millions for two millennia, is revealed here as one of the

greatest poets of all time. What happened to deafen us to the poetic nature of his words? In migrating from Aramaic speech into written Greek translation, and later into English translation, the lyrics got locked up as prose.

In *The Poems of Jesus Christ* Willis Barnstone unveils the essential poetry of the Gospels - Mark, Matthew, Luke, and John... Jesus's poems are wisdom lyrics and narrative parables, rich with garden, animal, and nature imagery. Austere and poignant, they carry the totality of the Gospels' message through the intensity of a single voice—the Gospel of Jesus.
