LEADERS RETREAT ESTABLISHES TWO GOALS

At a retreat with Eric Law in February, Evergreen Association leaders (Executive Committee, TEAM and Caucus leaders)



developed two specific goals for the coming year.

The first was conceived as the group shared that Evergreen is a well kept secret even in our own churches. All leaders attending were excited about Evergreen but felt that the Leader group had become the same faces for too long. The goal reads: The Leader group will each have told why he/she is excited about Evergreen so

that at least one person per leader is added to the faithful (participating body). Some of the action plans to accomplish this goal are testimonies in each newsletter and the development of an Evergreen video that will be ready for a first viewing by the Annual Meeting and further refined to show at the ABC/USA Biennial convention in Pasadena in June 2009.

The second group realized that even our churches that are in Seattle sometimes feel isolated about their ministry and mission.

They were concerned that we could help one another in various ways. Their goal statement: In the most culturally appropriate way, each caucus will identify a church with a need, and the people of the association will rally around to help address that need by the 2008 Annual Meeting. Caucuses have begun meeting to determine needs. Churches should hear more from caucuses.

EYE-CLINIC IN HAITI WAYS FOR US TO RESPOND

Rev. Dr. Ron Kirstein (an ABC counselor in the Seattle area) went to seminary with Nzunga and had opportunity to see him recently at their son's wedding. He forwarded this report about the need to get medicines to the eye clinic and to send used eye glasses.

Dear Ron,

Greetings. Here is some information on the eye clinic.

The Cap-Haitian eye clinic is the work of the American Baptist missionary couple, Dr. Hollis & Wanda Clark. It started in 1989 in the city of Cap-Haitien, the second largest city of Haiti, after Port-au-Prince, the capital. Since its beginning, the eye clinic is there to serve the poor of Haiti who would not have the opportunity and access to good medical care, specially the eye care. That is why it will never turn anybody away because of his or her economic status.

The old persons and the single mothers without any outside financial support and without any support from family members are the most vulnerable people. Most of them depend on the help from this clinic for their on going eye care. Without this assistance they become blind in a short period of time. This is the case with cataract and glaucoma patients.

The clinic provides total eye care

ranging from surgery of cataract, reparation of cornea, and other corrective vision operations. We service many other needs including checkups and treatment of glaucoma patients, counseling and spiritual services. Eye glasses have been a source of comfort to many who would not see well or read well without this modern corrective support.

Since its beginning the clinic has seen over 90,000 patients. In a month or two we will be hitting the record of 100,000 patients that have been treated at the Cap-Haitian eye clinic. Every month we perform about 40 eye operations of all kinds.

So behind each operation or each pair of eye glasses given out there is a story: a vision restored, a family saved by restoring the vision of the mother or the father, the provider; a future saved of a girl or boy who would go blind; another chance given to someone to continue to read his Bible or to write his books and letters.

We praise God that the Cap-Haitian eye clinic is being the channel God is using to heal the many who pass by.

What do we need at this point? Dr. Clark has retired and in spite of his retirement he continues to help with purchasing the medicines and some equipment. As of last March he arrived at the point that he will no longer help the eye

clinic purchase what is needed in order to continue the service.

We need an American licensed doctor who will be willing to use his license to help us buy the medicine.

Every two to three months, we would send the list of our needs and he will then order the medicines from the companies. Since my name is already on their list, it will be sort of an easy process.

Your Evergreen Association would help a great deal in this regard. ***Instead of sending us the money, that money would go directly to paying for the medicines*** (through United Mission giving). This would be an effective way of supporting the eye clinic.

Next Steps for ABC/USA

The beginning of April saw me in Florida meeting with the General Executive Council and deciding further recommendations to the General Board (Rev. Walter Heyman is our representative and Terri Simpkins serves on the General Board, too) about the restructure of our National Governance. I will share in the newsletter and in other ways the official papers as they are released.

At this point let I do want to share several things. First the meetings in

general were positive and forward thinking, rather than rancorous and negative as they have been at times in the past.

The recommendation for restructure helps the ABC in many ways to address some problems with the current structure. One of the things I like is the direct involvement a local church can have into the direction of the ministry and mission of ABC/USA. There is also a movement away from legislation and toward focus on mission. The National Program

Boards will be smaller, with greater autonomy while retaining appropriate interdependence.

Nothing will change unless the biennial delegates vote the necessary by-law changes. Plan now to attend the biennial in Pasadena in June of 2009. You can visit the website to see the plans that are being made: www.abc-usa.org/biennial/2009pasadena/biennial2009.htm

Galileans yet in their own tongue. So ridiculous was this scene to onlookers that they assumed that the disciples were drunk. But Peter rebukes them and shares this text saying, "This is not drunkenness, this is what was spoken of by the Prophet Joel."

As I think about what a Spirit-filled Evergreen Association looks like, I return to this text. Here the evidence of the Holy Spirit is a myriad of voices sharing and hearing the good news of Christ, together. Likewise, Evergreen is at its best when we come together sharing and hearing all of our voices—young and old, men and women, Black, Caucasian, Filipino, Japanese, Hispanic, First-Nations, clergy and lay. This is why I get most concerned within Evergreen when we seem to have only a few voices. It is

much harder to hear the Holy Spirit speaking when it comes from only a few voices.

I was in worship at New Beginnings for the kick-off of the Empowerment Conference where Dr.

Brenda Little shared the message, and in it she asked, "Is there a Sister here God can use?, Is there a Brother here God can use?" Her question rings in my mind as I come into Pentecost this year. Are there people out there God can use to reach this hurt and broken world? Are there people who can add what they hear the Spirit saying to the mix that we might have a clearer understanding of what God is saying to us? Are there people who are willing to live the image the scrip-

ture paints for us of how a "Spirit-filled" community looks?

Here the evidence of the Holy Spirit is a myriad of voices sharing and hearing the good news of Christ, together.

As we celebrate the pouring out of the Holy Spirit this month, it is my prayer that *that* same Spirit will revive our commitment to living out the Pentecostal community God

has called us to be.

An Urgent Call for Help on the Gulf Coast

VALLEY FORGE, PA (ABNS

04/17/08) — National Ministries needs more volunteers to build homes on the Gulf Coast during the 2008 Blitz Build in Baton Rouge, La., April 28 to May 17.

On behalf of American Baptist Churches USA, National Ministries is partnering with Habitat for Humanity of Greater Baton Rouge and the Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter Work Project 2008 to build 11 homes for 11 deserving families. Some of these families were displaced by hurricanes Katrina and Rita and have permanently relocated to Baton Rouge.

Although 210 generous American Baptists have already signed on to give their time and talent to this worthy cause, 20 more volunteers are needed for the week of April 28 – May 3 when the work will focus on framing exterior and interior walls, raising roof trusses and roof decking, and installing windows, doors and vinyl siding. More than 50 volunteers are still

needed for the week of May 12 – May 17 to complete vinyl siding, tape and float sheetrock, paint, and install trim work, cabinets and landscaping.

Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age. Construction skills are not required, but any knowledge of or experience with construction is appreciated. Volunteers are responsible for transportation to and from Baton Rouge and the work-site as well as a weekly fee of \$100 for food and lodging.

Originally, the Blitz Build plan called for construction of just five homes. Because of the committed efforts of American Baptist churches and volunteers, however, the Baton Rouge affiliate of Habitat for Humanity was successful in obtaining a matching grant through the Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter Work Project 2008, which

is focusing the efforts of its 25th annual work week on the Gulf Coast. Now American Baptist volunteers will be building a total of 11 homes.

Thousands are expected to volunteer across the Gulf Coast through the 2008 Carter Work Project.
